LETTER FROM THE LIBRARY

This past year was always going to be historic for The New York Public Library. It marked, in May 2020, the 125th anniversary of our founding—a testament to the enduring legacy of the Library as our most used and trusted civic institution. It was also a year of unprecedented challenges. New York City was an early epicenter of the coronavirus pandemic in the spring of 2020, forcing the closure of our physical locations and testing the resilience of our patrons and staff as New Yorkers supported each other through those harrowing months and the year that followed.

As demonstrated throughout 2020, our efforts to serve our city amid challenges define who we are as an institution. Despite the anxiety and unknowns we continue to face, at the Library we know one certainty: we are and will be here to support learning and opportunity for all New Yorkers, as we have been since our founding in 1895.

Steadiness Amid Uncertainty

Since its founding, The New York Public Library has served New York City through good times and bad. This past year brought forth unprecedented challenges for our city and patrons—but the Library quickly adapted to ensure that New Yorkers could continue to rely on our essential services.

UNINTERRUPTED SERVICE

In March 2020, as the pandemic forced New York City to shut down to slow the spread of COVID-19, the Library acted quickly to transition and expand its services to ensure that communities were still able to access the resources and information that they needed. While constantly monitoring the rapidly changing circumstances, the Library increased its core digital services—from e-book access to online learning support for students, remote research services, online programs, and virtual one-on-one job support.

Following the Library's temporary closure, patrons across the city—

and beyond—rushed to access and use our digital collections. In the first month, patrons checking out e-books increased more than threefold. Between mid-March and July of 2020, 65,000 new users signed up for SimplyE, the Library's free e-reader app, and 2 million e-books and e-audiobooks were checked out.

In late spring and early summer, as the city began its reopening efforts, the Library followed suit, offering contactless grab-and-go service at select locations, which was soon expanded to 50 locations across the Bronx, Manhattan, and Staten Island. Reinstating limited physical service proved vital for

communities; through the second week of grab-and-go services, patrons placed over 40,000 holds for pickup.

SYMBOLS OF RESILIENCE

The lions in front of our flagship location on 42nd Street were named Patience and Fortitude by Mayor Fiorello LaGuardia in the 1930s for qualities he felt New Yorkers needed during the Great Depression. Today, these beloved icons continue to stand watch over the Stephen A. Schwarzman Building as ongoing symbols of our values. They even donned face masks to help encourage mask-wearing—an act that drew attention not just in our city but around the world.

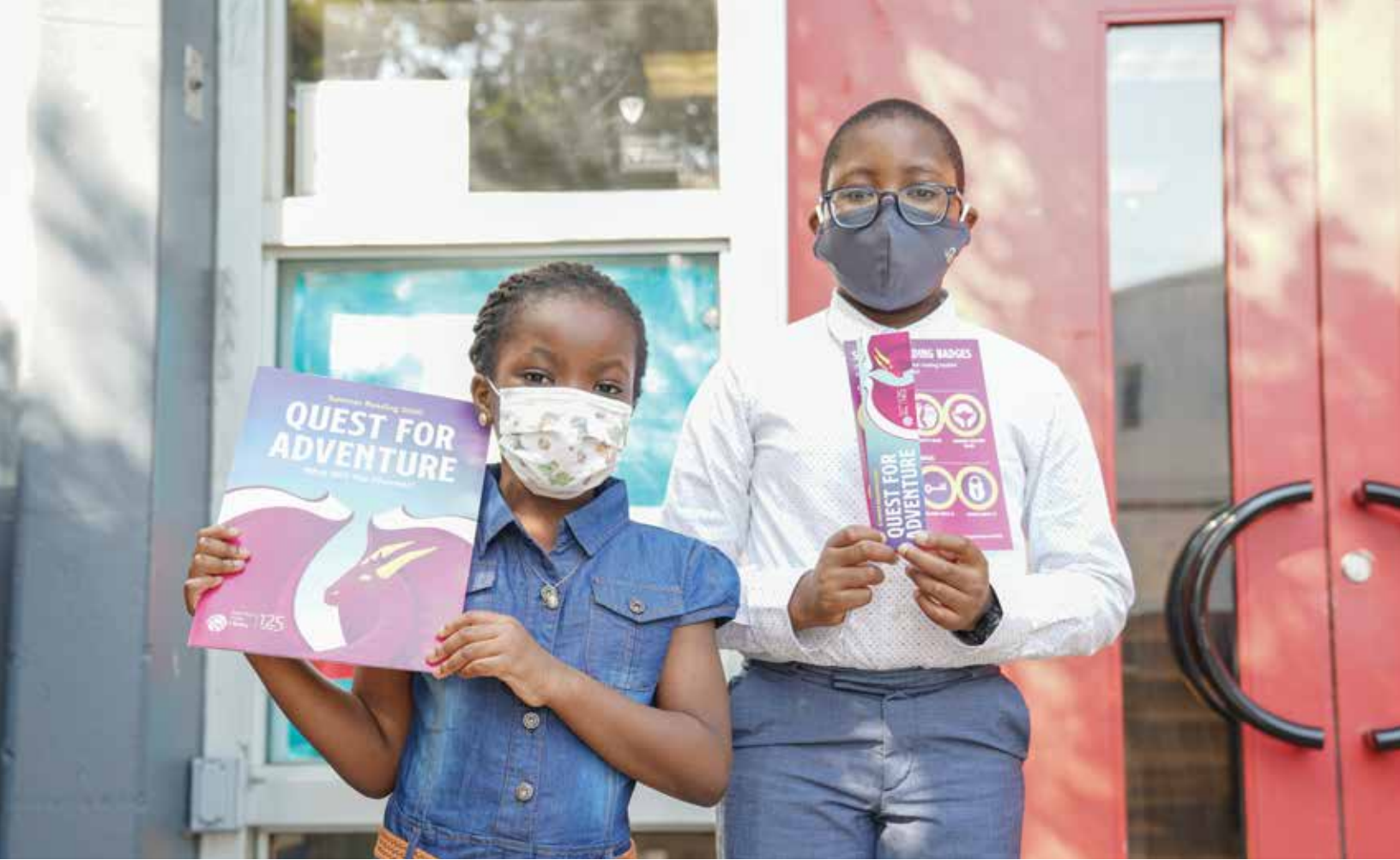

Education as a Lifeline

From storytimes to education support resources, the Library serves families and students of all ages, providing the tools they need to succeed. This past year was no different, as we quickly adapted to the challenges of remote learning and closures to provide our essential services in new and innovative ways.

REMOTE LEARNING

When New York City schools closed in March 2020, the Library immediately became a key partner for both families and educators in at-home learning. Our robust early literacy offerings moved online, with librarians recording hundreds of video storytimes that attracted high-profile organizations as partners. These programs featured readings, songs, rhymes, and early literacy tips; introduced special STEAM-themed episodes; and were offered in five languages.

NYPL also brokered an important partnership to bring after-school help online, offering access to one-on-one virtual tutoring in a range

of subjects for school-age kids and teens. Our School Support team pivoted to make sure teachers, administrators, and educators across the city were connected to our extensive online resources and learned how to apply them to the remote classroom.

ENSURING EQUITY

NYPL's 2020 Summer Reading "Quest for Adventure" became a major digital campaign with online reading trackers, author programs, and book clubs. We introduced Virtual Summer Camp, which provided kids with weeks of creative at-home activities accompanied by video tutorials from librarians.

As the new school year began, the Library continued to support remote learning across the city with these expanded digital resources, including online after-school programs.

One of the Library's core priorities is to bridge the digital divide and provide resources to patrons who cannot easily access the internet. Over the summer, NYPL raised money through partners to provide nearly 40,000 summer reading kits, including free books and learning tools, to families who couldn't participate in our online program. Despite the challenges 2020 presented, the Library remained a vital educational partner to all who needed us.

Reading Brings Us Together

Throughout our 125th anniversary year, the Library celebrated the power of books for readers of all ages and backgrounds. After the pandemic hit, we supported and strengthened our communities by expanding remote access to our collections—and guiding patrons to reliable resources.

MORE PEOPLE READING MORE

To kick off our anniversary in January 2020, we released our list of the Top 10 Checkouts of All Time, which featured a related special-edition library card and MetroCard and sparked a national—and even international—discussion of the importance of reading. Next came our series of anniversary book lists for all ages, 125 Books We Love, followed in May by an anniversary video, featuring celebrity writers, performers, and other leading voices honoring the power of reading and libraries to unite us.

We released more high-profile reading lists throughout 2020. The Library's Schomburg Center released its Black Liberation Reading

List in June to mark its own 95th anniversary as well as worldwide uprisings demanding justice for Black lives. NYPL's Essential Reads on Feminism coincided with the August centennial of the 19th Amendment—while our 2020 Election Reading List released in October encouraged voter engagement and awareness ahead of the election.

While e-books and our lists were key tools, connecting patrons with physical books remained a top priority for the Library. In October, we launched a new book selection service, Shelf Help, which quickly connected hundreds of patrons with physical materials.

Innovating For the Future

The Library was founded on the ideals of free and open access to knowledge and opportunity for everyone. As we looked to the future, we continued to innovate how we preserve and share our collections and services, ensuring that those founding principles remained central to our mission.

REIMAGINING RESEARCH

In 2020, the Library increased access to its world-class research collections in ways that will serve users for years to come. We expanded availability of our Scan & Deliver service to all of our research centers so that writers, scholars, college students, and creators can get increased remote access to more material than even before.

We also worked to build upon our collections for the modern age. Over the summer, we launched our Pandemic Diaries Project, an initiative that invited participants to submit audio recordings of themselves or their loved ones telling personal stories about life

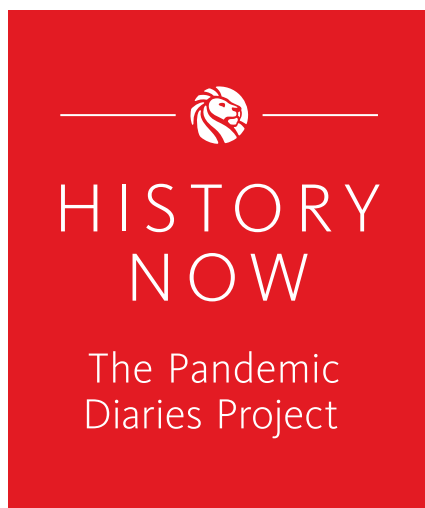
during the COVID-19 pandemic.

These stories will be archived in our research libraries and made available to future scholars, journalists, students, and the public.

At our Schomburg Center, a web-based archive, including state and local news and government responses, documented the African diaspora's experiences of COVID-19, including racial disparities in health outcomes and access, and its impact on Black-owned businesses. Meanwhile, the Library for the Performing Arts laid the groundwork for a new project that will provide tools for documentation to those who are currently underrepresented in the arts.

BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

The Library continued to invest in its spaces and infrastructure, both physical and online, to meet the needs of our patrons. Over the summer, the renovation of our largest circulating library in Midtown—the Stavros Niarchos Foundation Library (SNFL)—was completed, allowing it to operate as a grab-and-go location as part of our phased service restoration. When fully opened in 2021, it will feature eight floors of state-of-the-art services. Meanwhile, we continued to invest in our digital infrastructure to ensure we can continue to collect, preserve, and support our growing collections and serve our patrons in the years ahead.

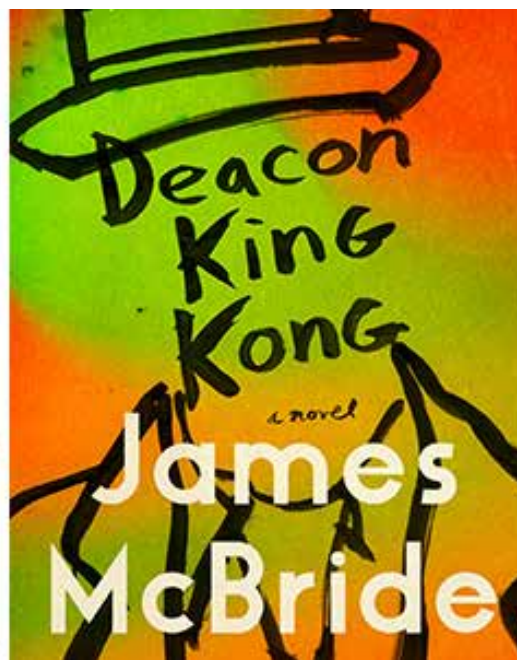

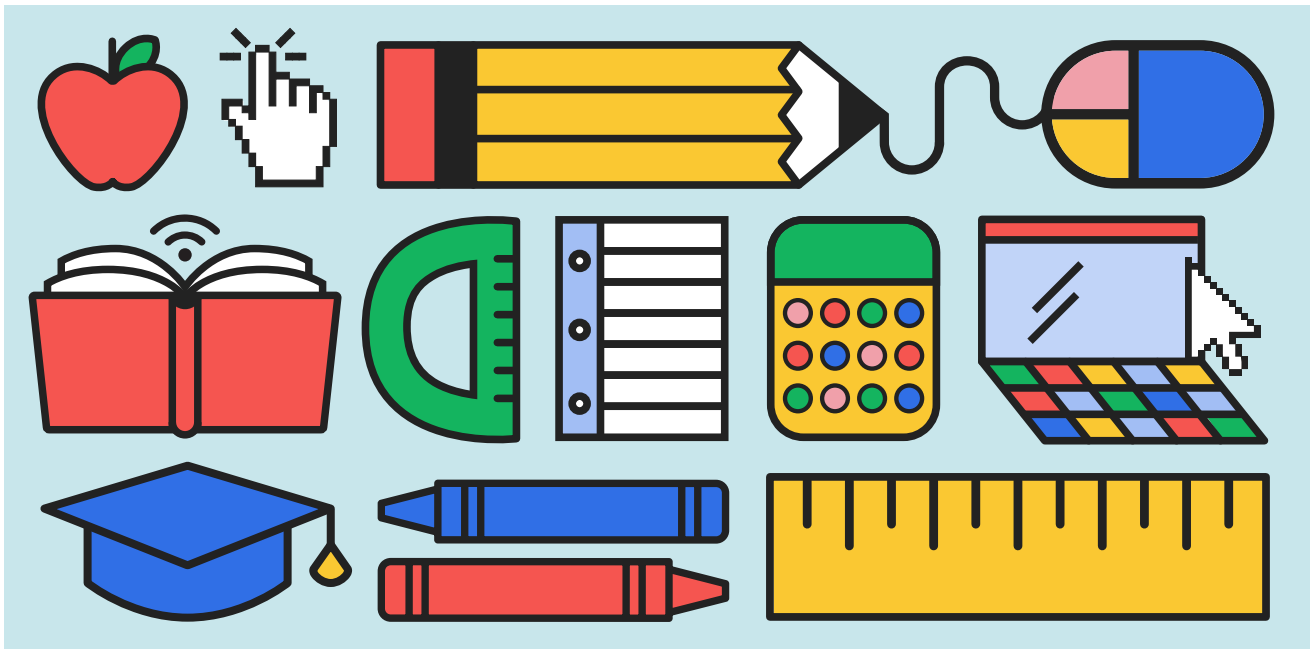

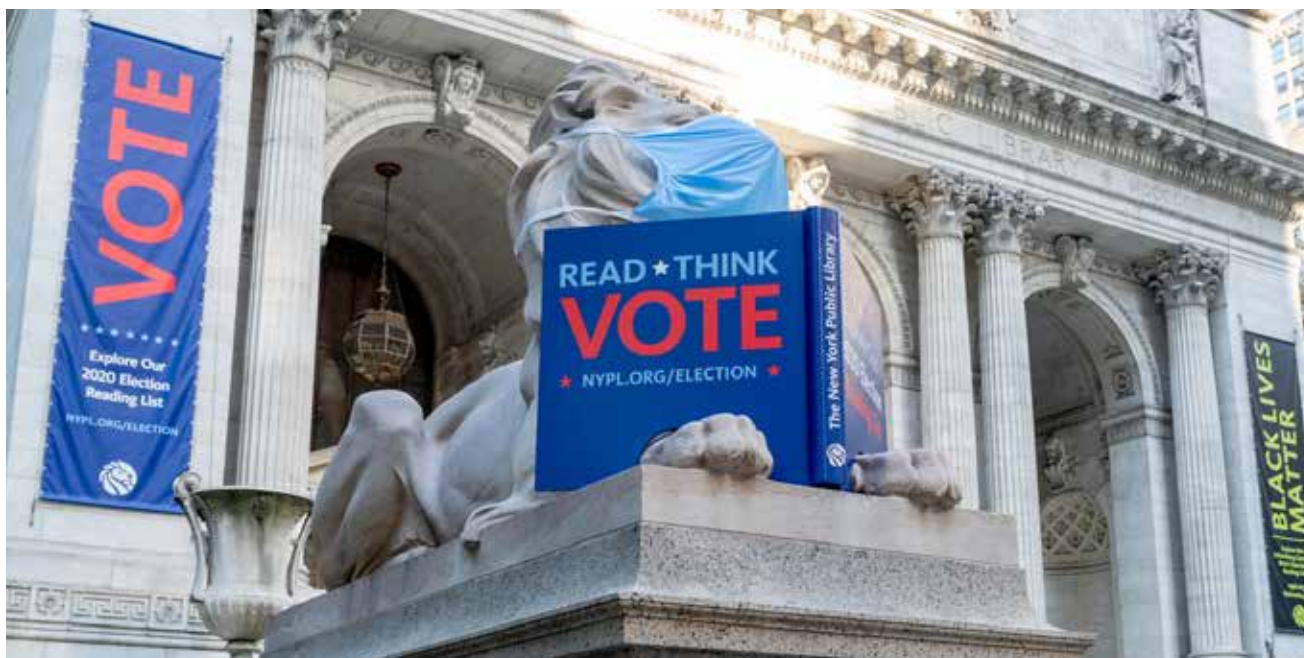

REPORT OF THE TREASURER

This year marks an important milestone for The New York Public Library, the 125th anniversary of our founding. We began 2020 focused on honoring the values the Library has upheld since 1895: free and open access to knowledge and information for all. However, 2020 has also brought unexpected challenges for NYPL, as the global coronavirus pandemic required location closures, changes to Library service models, and exceptional resilience from our staff and communities.

Despite closure of our physical locations in March 2020, the Library remained indispensable for our patrons, expanding access to digital resources, supporting distance learning, and holding our programs online. The Library also marked our anniversary and the importance of our legacy with a series of book lists. An online campaign in May celebrated NYPL's birthday, with a video love letter from Library fans, including Hillary Rodham Clinton, Al Roker, Jonathan Lethem, and more.

The Library adapted to this extraordinary year in a number of ways, including:

- Signing up 45,000 New Yorkers for digital cards through our free e-reader app, SimplyE, since March
- Starting in July, 50 locations opened for grab-and-go service to the public, including the newly renovated Stavros Niarchos Foundation Library (SNFL)
- The research libraries launched the Scan & Deliver service, allowing scholars and researchers to request digital copies of materials from our collections

The Library has maintained a strong financial position through this uncertain year. As of June 30, 2020, net assets were \$1.739 billion (vs. \$1.596 billion on June 30, 2019), reflecting an increase of \$143 million, or 9%. The increase in net assets over the most recent five-year period is 28%. The market value of our endowment on June 30, 2020, stood at \$1.265 billion. Long-term debt outstanding on June 30, 2020, was \$185 million.

Strong financial standing helps ensure the Library can continue to be the key community hub our patrons rely on. Throughout the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the Library demonstrated our importance to the city, even when our physical locations are closed, as thousands of New Yorkers took advantage of Library services. The support of our City, State, and Federal elected officials this year ensured the Library could continue to support our city through a time of enormous uncertainty.

By maintaining our strong financial position, we ensure The New York Public Library can continue the mission it has upheld for the past 125 years. We are grateful for the generosity of our donors and Board of Trustees and the support of our worldwide community which has maintained the Library as a beacon of knowledge, literacy, and opportunity for all.

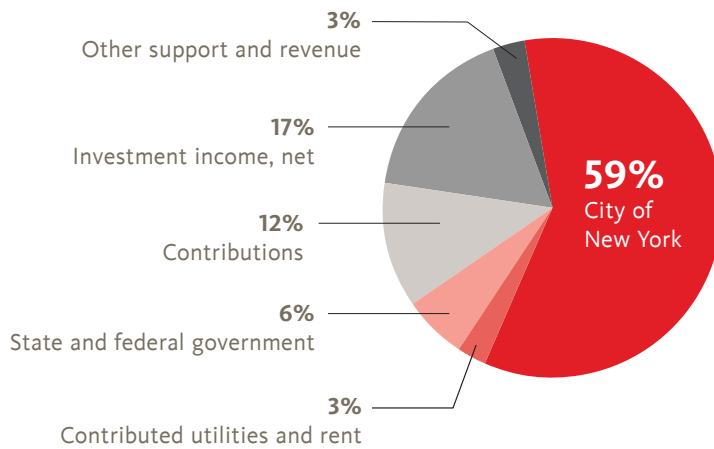

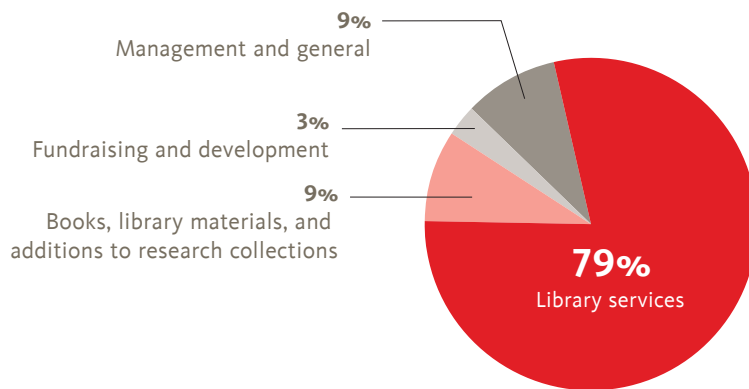

1. OPERATING REVENUES (\$329,595,000)

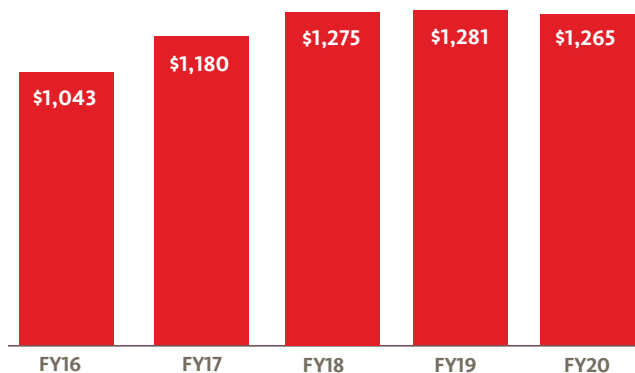


2. OPERATING EXPENSES (\$312,801,000)

RECOMMENDED FORM OF BEQUEST



The New York Public Library is a not-for-profit education corporation incorporated under the laws of the State of New York. The Library is exempt from federal income tax as an organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and is a publicly supported organization under section 170 of the Code.

Gifts and bequests to the Library are deductible under the federal income, estate, and gift tax laws. For federal tax purposes, the Library uses its formal corporate name: The New York Public Library, Astor, Lenox and Tilden Foundations (reflecting its incorporation by the consolidation of the Astor Library, the Lenox Library, and the Tilden Trust). The Trustees of the Library recommend that for estate planning purposes, friends consider the following language for use in their wills:

“I give and bequeath (dollar amount, percentage of residuary estate, or description of property) to The New York Public Library, Astor, Lenox and Tilden Foundations, Fifth Avenue and 42nd Street, New York, New York 10018, for the Library’s general purposes.”

If you wish to make a bequest for a specific purpose, it is suggested that you consider adding the following language to any restriction you may impose on your bequest:

“If at any time in the judgment of the Trustees of the Library, the designated purpose of this bequest proves to be impracticable or impossible, I authorize the Trustees to use the income and principal of this bequest for any purpose they deem to be consistent with the general intent and purpose set forth herein.”

Should you decide to leave a bequest to the Library in your will, you will become a member of the Library’s honorary legacy society, created to recognize the generosity of those individuals who include this institution in their estate plans. The Library expresses its gratitude to members during their lifetime by inviting them to special events and by listing their names on donor publications, unless they prefer to remain anonymous.
